Unfortunately we have one Congressman {Michael Grimm} who sees fit to ignore this and go off on his own trying to put an HR bill proclaiming March 30th "Welcome Home Vietnam Veteran". The reason I am bringing this to your attention is, despite our efforts in trying to make him understand that the 30th is not the historical date, or the fact that we the Vietnam Veteran want that date; he continues to ignore our wishes. Recently New York 1 upon their request asked us if they could meet with us and try to understand why the discrepancy in dates. The result from that interview was they edited out all that I said. Upon contacting NY1 their reply to us was if you didn't like it then you should not have done the interview -- I have attached my letter to the Congressman so you can read it. I also forwarded a copy to Senator Lanza, Assemblymen Titone and Representative Cusick. The bottom line here is our Congressman has to understand that he has to honor what his constituents want not what his own agenda is.

Before I close I would like to once again emphasize the importance of our Day of Remembrance. This year it will fall on June 10th and the time is 11:00. I cannot underline the impact your being there has on the families and friends of our 84. Make sure you take the time to share this service with all of us, like the wall it too is a healing process.

Here in New York State we have recently celebrated our 4th Vietnam Veterans Day at Tottenville HS. In attendance were Senator Lanza, Assemblymen Titone, Michael Cusick and a host of others representing different officials across the Staten Island. As you are well aware this day has been set aside to honor Vietnam Veterans. Its purpose is just to bring all Vietnam Veterans together and say thank you for service.

There are proclamations from New York State declaring March 29th Vietnam Veterans Day. This proclamation was introduced and sponsored by Senator Lanza and Assemblymen Titone and has been signed by all our local officials. The National President of the Vietnam Veterans of America, John Rowan also endorsed this day.

I am not going to list all the reasons why March 29^{th} is and always should be the official day. It is an historical fact dating back to President Nixon.

Your HR bill stating it is on March 30th and called "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans" is way off the mark and shows a lack of concern over what the Vietnam Veterans want.

Recently New York I called us {we did not reach out to them} and wanted to interview Lester Modelowitz and myself to understand why there was a discrepancy in the dates. Lester Modelowitz stated very clearly why it is on the 29th. When I was interviewed they edited out most of my statement which are written in this letter. After calling them and trying to understand why their answer was "It is up to the editor and if that is the case why did we do the interview".

After that statement and your insistence on not working with us on this matter $\mathcal I$ felt compelled to send you this letter of disagreement.

In closing I would like to personally say that I always thought our public servants were all about doing what their constituents want not their own agenda.

She resided in Short Hills, NJ as well as Jupiter, Florida. Unfortunately neither I nor anyone else in the chapter knew anything about Mrs. Mullens. I will keep everyone posted when and if I receive the remaining photos of our missing brothers. For those interested they are: Bobby James Perkins, David Neives, Walter Burke and Theodore Moon, Jr. There are no available photos of these brothers either in their High Schools on Staten Island and no one responded to the S.I. Advance articles requesting photos on these four. In closing, sure hope everyone enjoys the gorgeous weather we are having. 
